Schedule

10:00 A.M	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Stedelijk Museum<ul style="list-style-type: none">◦ Contemporary Art Museum at Museum Plein◦ You can book tickets in advance, but you can also buy them the morning of.
12:00 P.M.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• On your way to lunch, head over to Spiegelgracht and enjoy the antique stores, art galleries, and low key streets while strolling through.<ul style="list-style-type: none">◦ If you walk under the Rijksmuseum passage and there are people playing music, stop and enjoy their show, the passage is famous for their acoustics.• Then head over to the calm streets of Prinsengracht until you get to one of the famous landmarks of Amsterdam, the Magere Brug.<ul style="list-style-type: none">◦ We suggest you stop on it and take in the sight, this is also a great moment to take a selfie (watch out for the bikes though!) ;)
1:00 P.M.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Lunch time: Dignitá Hoftuin.<ul style="list-style-type: none">◦ In the heart of the gardens of the Hermitage Museum, this glass built restaurant offers an international brunch menu that will satisfy everyone's palates.◦ We recommend you reserve ahead of time, if it is a sunny day they also have seating outside.◦ vegetarian + vegan + gluten free options

Schedule

2:00 P.M.

- Post lunch, right next to the restaurant you will find the **National Holocaust Name Monument**.
 - A recent installation that holds the names of all the holocaust victims, it is a must if you plan on also visiting the Anne Frank Museum, or did not get a chance to get the tickets.
 - You might not see it at first because of it's optical illusion, but it is worth looking for!

2:30 P.M.

- Head over to the neighbourhood **de Pijp** and walk through the **Albert Cuypstraat** where you will find a market.
 - This is a regular market in the heart of the neighbourhood.
 - Once at the other end take the opportunity to get lost and window shop in this local neighbourhood.
- Alternatively: If you're feeling like you need a bit of rest and it is sunny, go ahead and lay down on the fresh grass of **Sarphatipark** right next to the market.

5:00 P.M.

- If at this point you need a **pick me up** here are some suggestions:
 - **Gelato:** Massimo Gelato - Authentic Italian Gelato.
 - If it's a sunny day you might find a line but it moves fast, and absolutely worth it.
 - We recommend the flavour Ricotta and Figs paired with Almond.
 - **A drink:**
 - La Dilettante - low key hidden away natural wine bar with a predominantly french aesthetic and wines.
 - Bar Mokum (opens at 5pm) - speakeasy vibes, serving cocktails based on locally produced liquors at a fixed price.
